1 CORINTHIANS 1:11-12

- ¹¹ For I have been informed concerning you, my brethren, by Chloe's *people*, that there are quarrels among you.
- ¹² Now I mean this, that each one of you is saying, "I am of Paul," and "I of Apollos," and "I of Cephas," and "I of Christ."

What Is The Church, Really?

- "Church" translates the Greek word
 "ekklesia" a group of people "called out"
 for a special purpose (Acts 19:32, 39, 41)
- A "collective" noun like the words club, group, class, herd, flock – all single words referring to "a group of members"
- ACTS 8:1 persecution arose against "the church" a singular group, yet made up of multiple people.

What Is The Church, Really?

- When we add "of Christ" to "church" we modify this collective noun – so, saying "church of Christ" is the same as "Christ's church"
- A "church of Christ" is a group of people who belong to Jesus.
- A "church of Christ" is a "church of God" and vice-versa.
- "Church" scripturally used in three senses:
 - LOCAL (I Cor. 1:2)
 - REGIONAL (Gal. 1:2; Acts 9:31)
 - UNIVERSAL (Matt. 16:18)

PRACTICAL APPLICATIONS

- Since being a Christian means I belong to Christ, I can't be a Christian without also being part of the "church of Christ."
- If you think the phrase "church of Christ" means merely a division, part, or segment of the universal body of Christ, you misunderstand Christ's church.
- "Church of Christ" is not the only, official name of the Lord's body (Eph. 1:22-23)
 - "church of Christ" (Rom. 16:16)
 - "the church of God in Corinth" or Cypress? (I Cor. 1:2)

PRACTICAL APPLICATIONS

- "the church of God in Christ Jesus that is in Judea" or Cy-Fair? (1 Thess. 2:14)
- "the Way" (Acts 24:14)
- "the church of the Thessalonians" or Cy-Fairians (I Thess. 1:1)
- "the church of the living God" (I Tim. 3:15)
- "the saints in Christ Jesus at Philippi" or Cyfair (Phil. 1:1)
- "the assembly of the firstborn" (Heb. 12:23)

PRACTICAL APPLICATIONS

- "the household of God" (1 Tim. 3:15)
- "the church" (Eph. 1:23)
- Our sign out front could have any scriptural name on it, and we would still be a "church of Christ." WARNING: All signs saying "Church of Christ" may not be accurately describing that church.
- We must watch our terminology closely.
- We must not say "all the other denominations," for we are not a denomination!

"Church of Christ Christians?"

We should tell people how to become Christ's people.
